
Job Title: Festival Coordinator

Eastern Edge Gallery is seeking a **Festival Coordinator** who will assist with the implementation of the HOLD FAST Contemporary Arts Festival, tentatively scheduled for May 26th - 30th, 2021.

We are now in our 22nd year of celebrating contemporary art practices in St. John's, Newfoundland and Labrador! HOLD FAST delivers accessible, meaningful and critically-relevant arts programming across an array of media including: installation, performance, screenings, artist talks, dance, community events and artist-led workshops for people of all ages.

The Festival Coordinator will assist with the logistical planning of various aspects of the festival, including, but not limited to:

- Work towards creating a festival which centres intersectional, BIPOC, queer, and feminist practices through equitable, diverse, and inclusive programming
- Work to uphold the commitments outlined in our <u>Collective Statement</u> challenging current systems
  of oppression and barriers to access within the arts
- Expanding the presence of the Festival in local and national networks
- Actively seeking out new volunteers for HOLD FAST
- Supporting the development of sponsorships and donations
- Reinforce existing relationships with partnering organizations
- Working with invited artists to coordinate the many aspects of their participation
- Working with gallery staff and invited artists to organize volunteers for events
- Securing permission to operate in various spaces within the city

- Sourcing supplies for workshops and installations
- Assisting with all festival promotions; including the production and the distribution of the Festival program, posters, flyers, social media, and the Eastern Edge website.
- Working with gallery staff to gather information and complete reporting on HOLD FAST 2021

The ideal candidate for this position would have interest and/or relevant experience in contemporary visual art. We are looking for an enthusiastic candidate who possesses the following skills:

- Excellent communications skills
- Understands and shows enthusiasm for our mandate, and artist-run culture
- Enjoys working with the public
- Experience with Google Drive and Adobe Creative Suite and/or Canva
- Experience with managing various social media
- Must excel at organization and planning.
- Demonstrated thoroughness and attention to detail.
- Must be able to take responsibility for tasks and see those tasks through to completion.
- Must be able to meet deadlines, perform under pressure and delegate tasks when required.
- Must be self-motivated, able to work both independently and as part of a team.
