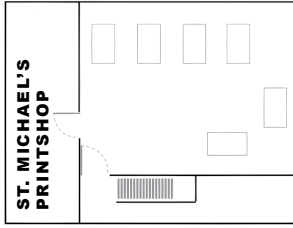

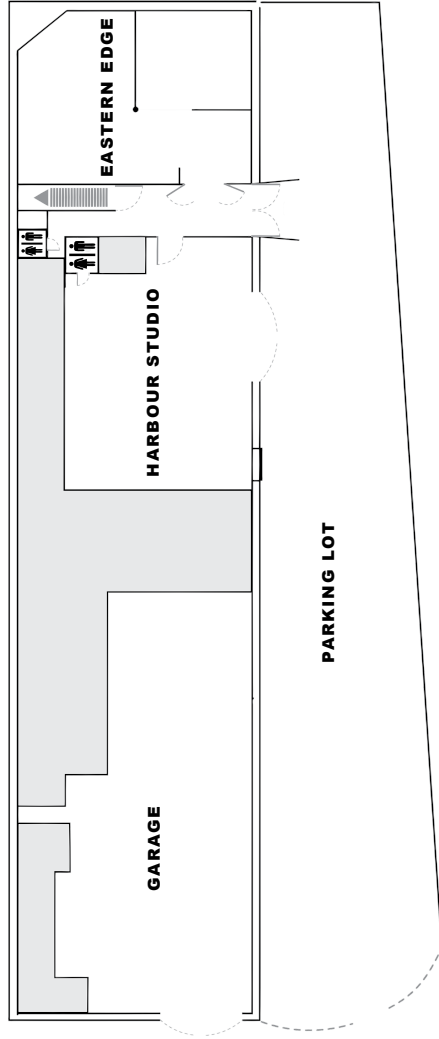

WORK WORK WORK is a looped sequence of three performance-based videos that addresses themes of mechanized body gestures, the disciplining of the body, and the relationship between performed action, the creative process and the production of an object.

Karen Zalamea works in and between photography, video, performance and sculpture.

Her artistic practice enquires into the relationship between the body, gesture, labour, repetition and rhythm. In 2009, she completed a Master of Fine Art degree at Concordia University under the supervision of Manon De Pauw. She is the recipient of several awards, including the inaugural Sylvie and Simon Blais Foundation Award for Emerging Visual Artists. Her work has been exhibited and screened in Canada, the United States, England, France, Germany, the Netherlands and Mexico. Karen Zalamea lives and works in Montréal.

**ANDREA CARVALHO
PLACE DE GALO (MOVING A MONUMENT)**

Place de Galo is a portable and inflatable sculpture that provides an alternative to the permanent public monument as a site for fixed collective memories. As a portable monument it recognizes the varied histories and perspectives in any given place, allowing one to carry their stories and histories with them.

Andrea's practice explores the variable connections to sites and place through research on the built environment, non-places,

and the notion of belonging. Working mostly within sculpture and installation, her work also includes site-specific performance, drawing, and text. Before completing her MFA at Concordia University, Andrea worked at the Norfolk Arts Centre, the Harbourfront Centre, and sat on the board at the Hamilton Artists Inc. This year she will be working as an artist in residence in Windsor ON, Kamloops BC, Nova Scotia and exhibiting at Ross Creek Centre for the Arts NS, Forest City Gallery ON, and The Robert McLaughlin Gallery ON.
